We are a nonprofit organization whose mission is to help students, ages 5 to 18, become skilled at communicating by offering individualized tutoring, writing workshops, and educational events.

How much does camp cost? Surely something like this must be expensive!

Camp is free, but a deposit is necessary so that we know you will show up. If you don't show up, you forfeit the deposit. If you do show up every day, you can get it back at the end of the week or give it to us. We have obtained generous help from numerous local organizations and nice folks who want to make this experience possible for anyone who wants to come. We are a nonprofit organization, so any help you or your parents want to give us is greatly appreciated (& tax-deductible)!

How long is camp? Can I live there?

Camp will be from 9-5, Monday through Friday, and it is important that you stick with us all five days. Don't show up more than 15 minutes before camp begins, or stay more than 15 minutes after camp ends, because adults need more sleep than even y'all do.

Do I have to bring my own food?

We will have limited quantities of snacks. We suggest that you bring a water bottle, just in case. You will need to bring your own lunch, but know that we are trying to get you some free food, as well!

Will we stay in the same place all of the time?

Never! We believe that writers need to experience as much of the world as possible so that they can feed their imaginations AND write stuff about the world. We will go on a field trip almost every day. This means that you need to wear shoes you can walk at least two miles in (probably no flip-flops), clothes that are comfortable and modest, and sunscreen. You should probably bring a backpack, too.

Can I bring a friend/sister/brother/parent/pet?

We will take friends/sisters/brothers if they are of the correct age, turn their own applications in on time, and convince us they really want to go. Parents, grandparents, guardians, and pets are not really part of this. Prepare yourself to meet new people! Oh -- a warning. If cell phones or other electronics become a problem, we will ask you to turn them off or not bring them. Be independent!

Who are the adults who will be hanging out with us?

Most of the adults will be MDPL volunteers. Many of them will be teachers on summer break, or college students, or adults who just really like to write and hang out with kids. All of them will be fun and knowledgeable. Parents: all primary volunteers are background-checked and kids are never left alone with a volunteer in a private place.

Frequently Asked Questions, continued

Your flier said that only thirteen kids could participate, and that the kids would be chosen based on how much they want to come. Can you explain that?

Surely! We would like to take all of the kids in the world who love writing, but we cannot yet make sure that we have enough adults to work with each student. So, this year we are only going to take students who take the time to write to us to tell us why they want to come and how they will help us make this the best Summer Writing Camp possible. We will take the thirteen kids who turn in their applications, **completed, with the deposit**, and with really good explanations of why they want to be there, to Metro Denver Promotion of Letters by our deadline -- **April 6, 2011**. If you aren't chosen right away, we will put you on the waiting list, but you might have to wait until next year. MDPL runs workshops during the schoolyear, and camp is every year, so don't be too sad if you aren't chosen this time.

Parents: it is up to MDPL to determine who the thirteen participants are. Our say is final.

Where and how do I turn in my application?

What a great question! You can do one of three things:

3. If you are really anxious or don't trust the Post Office, you can call us at 303-518-4138 and find out a place to drop it off.

How will I know if I get to participate in camp and if my application is accepted?

We will call you to let you know if you will be one of our writers by **May 2, 2011**. We will also call the next ten kids on the waiting list to let them know that they might have a spot; we'll call people on the list as soon as a spot opens up. We will send letters to everyone else so they can say yes to all of the other summer camps that they want to attend!

If I get in, what comes next?

We will send you ANOTHER information packet a few weeks before camp, and we will probably call you, too. You'll get to know us.

Medical Emergency Consent Form & Contacts

In the event that my child, (print child's name) _____, has a medical emergency, I authorize the adult workers at Metro Denver Promotion of Letters to consent to any examination, x-ray, anesthetic, medical or surgical diagnosis or treatment, and hospital care my child may require, as long as it is rendered under the supervision of a physician or surgeon who is licensed under the Medical Service Act and serves on the medical staff of a licensed hospital -- whether or not the diagnosis or treatment is rendered at that physician's office or hospital.
